ABOUT SRI VENAKTESWARA COLLEGE

Sri Venkateswara College was established by T.T. Devasthanams in 1961 and acknowledged as one of the prestigious co-educational colleges in South Campus, University of Delhi. The college has been conferred upon the coveted STAR STATUS College by the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India. The College offers an array of undergraduate programmes in basic and applied sciences, humanities and commerce. We at Sri Venkateswara College believe in imparting education that is an amalgamation of strong academic foundation and moral values. The college imparts value based education to students through innovative pedagogy and state-of-art research facilities. The College provides the right ecosystem for holistic personality development of students and promote and motivate them to excel in diverse fields such as visual and performing arts, sports and entrepreneurship. Sri Venkateswara College today has nearly 180 dedicated teaching and more than 100 non-teaching staff members and around 3500 students on its roll. Members of special committees as experts: Faculty members have served as experts in organizations such as Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, Research committees, editorial board of journals, NCERT, UGC course revision committees etc.

Research projects: The College has received research projects with international and national funding agencies in Sciences as well as social sciences. The major government funding agencies are Cluster Innovation Centre, DU; National Mission on Himalayas, MoEFCC; DST; DBT. The college also has research projects with industry academia interface; Dr. Vartika Mathur is collaborating with Eureka Forbes for analyzing indoor air pollution.

Ph.D. supervision: Faculty members are guiding Ph.D. students and around 8 Ph.D. students are pursuing Ph.D. under Dr. R. P. Singh, Dr. N. Latha, Dr. KC Singh, Dr. Anant Pandey, Dr. Vartika Mathur

Development of E-resources: Faculty member have significantly contributed towards development of e-resources as online lesson plans under the TROPICSU climate programme of IISER Pune. Around 10 lesson plans have been uploaded and many more are in the pipeline, and 20 teachers of departments of chemistry, botany, zoology, mathematics and sociology have been associated with the process. Under the same a workshop was conducted in the college in October 2018, and faculty members also visited IISER Pune for a workshop in March 2019. Our teachers are also involved in NCERT and have contributed and reviewed e-resources under the NROER programme of MHRD.

ADD ON COURSES in the session 2018-2019

The College offered Add-on courses for students on contemporary topics. These courses were open to students of other universities and colleges, and were in addition to the routine undergraduate courses. A total of four add-on courses were conducted in this academic year in addition to the ongoing certificate courses in foreign languages like Spanish, German.
