Union of India & Ors (Defacement Case)", The Delhi Prevention of Defacement of Property Act, 2007. While making the decision you should remember that only those candidates will be able to promote your cause, who follow the rules and regulations, care for the environment by saving paper used for making posters, help maintain the beauty of your city by refraining from defacing its walls, or indulging in any other illegal activities.
