A diverse, approachable, and successful network of alumni is of immense support and importance to students. It was only opportune to get some of them back to the college. Many would have liked to join online given their jobs abroad. Nonetheless, we had a great session on Alumni Interactions. The students of various years in the college in the past who have pursued BA Programme recollected how important the college was to them in their later life.

In the introduction, Tushita Agnihotri (Resources Head) remarked that Rishabh Pant was not the only alumni we should be proud of, we have a set of hardworking ones across different disciplines and sectors. The session ended up being a beautiful one where alumni shared their diverse work and study experience.

Starting off with this session, Lavanya Udaya Verma, a student of the outgoing batch of 2022, leaving for London for her higher studies presented a fascinating documentary on mental stress. There was a high level of appreciation for the same and a set of Q&A followed. In his welcome speech, Treasurer Gurumukh Lamba felt proud that he is able to present to the house such an ikystriiys set of alumni.

Sasidharan Sharma drew attention to the huge benefits he gained from being part of the college. His interdisciplinary studies in Economics and Mathematics held him in good stead. He recollected his brief stay in Rajasthan after his college doing his MA when he cleared the Junior Research Fellowship of the UGC and then received an internship at the Reserve Bank of India. In the next attempt, he joined the master's course in JNU through the entrance. Currently working under the mentorship of Dr Brishthi Guha, he drew attention to the challenges and ceaselessly learning opportunities offered by the world of research.

Bhargav, an alumnus of the MA course at Delhi School of Economics, drew attention to the passion for mathematics inculcated in him by the college. Not having learned Maths after Class 10, on realizing that he will not be able to do Economics at the higher level, he had to do self-study and pick up maths himself. He reflected on the audience his tryst with mathematics. And, further, he tried to illustrate how it was possible to prove many there's and rules through argument and logic. Currently preparing for civil services, economics continues to interest him, he remarked.


