# About The Conference

The NAAC has been carrying out the process of quality assessment and accreditation of HEIs over the past two decades. Several HEIs have gone through this process and a sizeable number have also undergone subsequent cycles of accreditation. True to its commitment for promoting quality culture in HEIs in consonance with the overall developments in the field of higher education across the world, NAAC has been striving to be sensitive to adequately reflect these in its processes and parameters. The A&A process of NAAC continues to be an exercise in partnership with the HEI being assessed. Over the years, the feedback received from the HEIs and other stakeholders as well as the developments in the national scenario of HEI have contributed significantly in making appropriate revisions in the process so as to accelerate the process with greater rigour.

The Revised Assessment and Accreditation Framework which is in line with NEP – 2022 represents an explicit Paradigm Shift making it ICT – enabled, objective, transparent, scalable and robust. The Shift is:

- From the previous qualitative peer judgment to data based quantitative indicatorwise evaluation with increased objectivity and transparency.
- Towards extensive use of ICT confirming scalability and robustness in terms of simplification of the process, drastic reduction in the number of questions, size of the Self Study Report, reduction in the number of peer team visit days, and such others.





- **Boosting benchmarking as quality improvement tool. This has been attempted through comparison of NAAC indicators with those of other international QA frameworks**
- **Introducing the System Generated Scores (SGS) with combination of online evaluation (about 70%) and peer judgment (about 30%)**
- **Introducing Pre-qualifier before the peer team visit, as 25% of the SGS.**
- **Introducing the element of a third-party verification and validation of data**
- **providing appropriate differences in the matrices, weightages and benchmarks between those of the universities, autonomous colleges and affiliated/constituent colleges**
- **Revising several quantitative and qualitative matrices to bring in enhanced participation of students and alumni in the assessment process. The time has come to align the principles of NEP – 2020 with different criteria as given below in practice for insuring multi-disciplinary approach in higher education.**

## Criteria of NAAC and Key Indicators

The criteria-based assessment forms the backbone of A&A process of NAAC. The seven criteria represents the core areas of functions and activities of an HEI. In the revised framework the academic and administrative aspects of institutional functioning is not only focused but also the emerging issues have been included. The seven Criteria to serve as basis for assessment of HEIs are Curricular Aspects, Teaching Learning evaluation, Research , Innovation and Extension, Infrastructure and learning resources, Students Support and Progression, Governance, Leadership and Management and Institutional values and best practices.

Taking into the consideration of the above criteria in mind, the Research Development Cell of NSU is taking a little step to organize an International Conference for strengthening Higher Education and spreading awareness about the following subthemes related to it.

## Rules for writing and submitting Abstract with full Paper:

Participants are required to follow the guidelines for the presentation of their articles which would be published by the University.

## Guidelines for Article (7th edition)

An APA style research format is different as compared for a term article, a creative writing article, a composition-style article, or a thought article. Throughout the article you need to apply these guidelines while writing the paper.

**Page Layout:** Type the content and keep double line spacing on standard-sized paper (8.5" x 11"), with 1" margins on all sides. You should indent the first line of every paragraph 0.5 inches. Include a page number on every page.

Article: (Paper must be original in nature)

Your article must contain an abstract which should not be more than 120 words and should be in one paragraph with double spacing. Additionally, state the topic in a line or two. In the case of research article, provide overview of methodology, discussion of results, educational implications, and suggestions along with objectives, hypotheses, and related reviews. Mention authors details and the name of Institution s/he belongs to. Multiple authors will get certificates as per their registrations. There will be an award for Best Research Article for Research Scholars and Post Graduate Students. Paper received after the specified date will not be accepted for publication. Selected Papers will be published in ISBN Volume. Participants will be informed about the publication fees and payment after the process is completed.

Provide an alphabetical listing of the references. Do not keep extra spaces between references and double-space in all the references. The second line of each reference should be intended. You could refer to the examples (mentioned below) to know how to format references correctly.

### I. Journal Article:

Only first letter of the first word of the article title is capitalized; the journal name and volume are italicized. If the journal name had multiple words, each of the major words is capitalized.

Example: Ebner- Priemer, U. W., & Trull, T. J. (2009). Ecological momentary assessment of mood disorders and mood dysregulation. *Psychological Assessment*, 21, 463-475. Doi:10.1037/a0017075

### II. Book Chapter:

Only the first letter of the first word of both the chapter title and book title are capitalized.

Example: Stephan, W. G. (1985). Inter group relations. In G. Lindzey & E. Aronson (Eds.), *The handbook of social psychology* (3rd ed., Vol. 2, pp. 599-658). New York: Random House.

### III. Book: Example: Gray, P. (2010). *Psychology* (6th ed.). New York: Worth
