### Summary Report

The Equal Opportunity Cell of Sri Venkateswara College organized its annual fest Sarthak 2018-19 on 7<sup>th</sup> of March 2019 from 10:30 AM to 6:00 PM. It was a university level fest in which around 120 students from different colleges across Delhi University, like St. Stephens, LSR, Ramjas, KMC, Miranda house and PGDAV, to name a few, participated.

Mrs. Shalini Khanna, the chief guest of the event is the director of NAB India Centre for Blind Women and Disability Studies, a consultant of prevention of sexual harassment and a panelist of sexual harassment prevention committees which conducts training workshops, makes investigations and policies with several corporates and the Government of India.

The chief guest enlightened everyone by sharing accounts on the life of differently abled women and how NAB India is helping those women to have a better life by helping them to study and building their career. She told the students about the importance of education and training and how it can empower women. Differently abled women, when given an opportunity to learn skills and knowledge can stand up on their own feet to support themselves, financially as well as socially. The speech was very inspiring and motivating for everyone.

The competitions followed the speeches. Firstly, the talent hunt event was held in which participants solely performed in three categories namely, Singing, Dancing and Miscellaneous. The participants showed a lot of enthusiasm and performed very well. Each participant was given 4 minutes for the performance. Then the Quiz competition, in collaboration with the Quiz Society of Sri Venkateswara College, was conducted, in which teams participated with zeal and showcased their knowledge. Teams included two students each, including one PWD and one general category student. In all the

categories of talent hunt and quiz competitions cash prizes were awarded to the winners, for the 1st prize: Rs. 1800, 2nd prize: Rs. 1300 and 3rd prize: Rs. 800. The judges of the talent hunt event encouraged the participants and motivated them to do their best, they also gave their blessing to everyone for a better life.

Nitin Dhiman and Ananya Dikhshit, two volunteers of EOC, anchored all of the events before lunch time. A tasty lunch was served to the participants and the volunteers. After lunch, One Act Play competition was held in which teams from different colleges took part. Each student was given 15 minute for their performance. The winners were awarded with cash prizes, 1st prize: Rs 2000, 2nd prize: Rs. 1500 and 3rd prize: Rs. 1100. The event was anchored by Sonam and Pratisha, two volunteers of EOC. All of the participants gave mesmerizing performances.

The competition was judged by the EOC convernor, DR. Kanvar Singh and Dr. Rajkishor. Both of the judges motivated and appreciated the students throughout the event. The students were delighted to hear their kind words. And lastly the Hindi poetry competition was held.
