## ANNUAL SEMINAR OF EOC 2019-2020

We organized EOC's annual seminar on 6th November, 2019 on the topic FAKE NEWS AND MISINFORMATION AND WAYS TO CHECK IT. Mr. Kartikay Harbola was the honourable chief guest of this session. Mr. Harbola, a renowned journalist, is a member of the Lok Sabha Secretariat, as well as a speaker of the media team under current Lok Sabha Speaker Mr. Om Birla. The guest speaker addressed the students to the issue of fake news circulation and misinformation and ways to curb it.

#### FURTHER PROSPECTS

- We are planning to conduct Inter-college Sports Tournaments and meets.
   Through sports, PWD students would acquire vital social, physical and psychological skills, develop independence, and become empowered to act as agents of change.
- We are also planning to constitute a help desk during admissions that could help PWD students in form filling and other admission related assistance.
- We are also looking to install number plates in braille script outside the classrooms for easy identification of classes for visually impaired students.
- For wheelchair students we are requesting our college to construct special washrooms and also an EOC room for all kinds of paperwork and meetings.
