

LIBRARY

BIOINFORMATICS CENTER

The center was established in the year 2006 with an objective to promote Biology teaching through Bioinformatics, with initial funding from the Department of Biotechnology (DBT) under the Biotechnology Information System (BTISnet) program. The BIC caters to the computational and bioinformatics needs of the undergraduate students, research scholars and teaching staff members from various departments of the college.

ICT FACILITY

The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled. SVC has its own active directory domain server for Wi-Fi security and network security and provides every student, faculty and staff with their unique ID. Our internet resource lab has 80 systems, and we have three computer labs with 130 systems for student's use.

- By the end of every third month the resident has to pay another 3 months of mess advance at the same rate along with the excess on actual Mess charges of the previous 3 months, otherwise the mess facilities of the residents will be withdrawn.
- Fee is subject to change as per the decision of the College Governing Body.
- Hostel Security amount will be refundable only after the room has been vacated. Hostel
 Mess Security and Caution money are refundable through cheque only. Application has to
 be made on a prescribed form along with the photocopy of the room vacation slip and
 submitted to the hostel office .Security Money has to be claimed within one year after
 leaving the hostel, beyond which the same lapse to the Hostel Account.
- In case of withdrawal, annual charges will not be refunded. However, monthly room charges will be realized only up to the month in which withdrawal is sought. It is calculated from the date of the written application's submission to the Warden for the withdrawal of admission.
- Hostel charges are subject to revision from time to time.
- In case a student after being admitted wants to get his/her admission cancelled, he/she will be entitled to refund of fees as per hostel/ college rules.



SUBJECT: FEE REFUND POLICY 2023-24

The University Grants Commission has considered the matter in its 570th meeting held on 27 June 2023, and after considering the relevant factors decided, the following fee refund policy for the academic session 2023-24 vide D.O. No.F.2-71/2022 (CPP-11) dated 3 July, 2023.


- Notwithstanding anything contained in any guidelines prospectus/ notification schedule. a full refund of fees shall be made by the HEIS on account of all cancellations of admission/migrations of students up to 30 September 2023 and with a deduction of not more than Rs. 1,000, as a processing fee, up to 31 October 2023
- For any admission schedule extending commencing beyond after 31 October 2023, the provisions contained in the UGC Notification issued in October 2018 on Refund of Fees and Non-Retention of Original Certificates shall apply (reproduced below for ready reference):

Category	Percentage of Refund of fees*	Point of time when notice of withdrawal of admission is received in the <u>HEI</u>
(1)	100%	15 days or more before the formally notified last date of admission
(2)	90%	Less than 15 days before the formally notified last date of admission
(3)	80%	15 days or less after the formally notified last date of admission
(4)	50%	30 days or less, but more than 15 days after formally notified last date of admission
(5)	00%	More than 30 days after formally notified last date of admission

- It may also be noted that the UGC has notified the Redressal of Grievances of Students Regulations. 2023 wherein "delay in, or denial of the refund of fees due to a student who withdraws admission within the time mentioned in the University Schedule, subject to guidelines, if any, issued by the Commission from time to time" has been defined as one of the grievances.
