


Session I (Inaugural Ceremony)

The inaugural session began with Prof. Vimal Rarh, the National Coordinator, FDP extending a warm welcome to all the FDP collaborators and the participants while outlining the objectives of the same. The FDP aims to train teachers to adapt their teaching to the technological demands of the current century in keeping with larger aspirations to make education accessible to all. Prof. Rarh highlighted that the FDP is a unique flexible collaboration on a national level aimed at developing a new pedagogy of teaching in institutes of higher education in the country which could be a blueprint for the future of education in India.

Prof. Jaswinder Singh, Director GAD-TLC and Principal SGTB Khalsa College, emphasized how this exercise would be a platform for teachers with exceptional potential to translate the same into e-Kits and MOOCs making the journey of learning open to all irrespective of constraints of affordability or age.

Prof. A.K. Bakhshi, Chairman GAD –TLC exhorted that initiatives such as this FDP as the quality of education is dependent on the competence of teachers and how this FDP believed in empowering the latter. The other heads of the collaborating institutions spoke about how projects such as this could enliven learning with innovation and remedy many of the challenges faced as those of distance and teacher-centric teaching.

The keynote address "Digital Transformation in Higher Education in India: Challenges and Opportunities" delivered by Prof. A.K. Bakhshi made the participants aware of the various challenges in the field of education in the current century and how technology could be a panacea for all these. Embracing technology could ensure a different social alignment which would ensure opportunities for all with an exciting trajectory of self-learning, diverse in scope and ambition enabling life-long learning with linguistic barriers overcome. MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses), Emodules are the future of global education and this FDP aims at training competent teachers to frame these pedagogical tools. The session ended with a vote of thanks by Prof. Sarita Passey, Co-Coordinator, FDP which was followed by an enthusiastic Q & A session.





Day-2 Date-01-05-2023 Session 1

Topic: FOUR QUADRANT FORMAT OF e-CONTENT AND MOOCS

Resource Person: Prof. Vimal Rarh

The Day 2 of the FDP began with **Prof. Vimal Rarh's session**. She is a Professor of Chemistry at SGTB Khalsa College University of Delhi, Project Head & Joint Director of GAD-TLC, and Coordinator of the National Resource Centre of Chemistry.


The session began with explaining the essential requirements of the FDP, details about attendance, assessment parameters, certification requirements, etc. to the participants.

This was followed by the topic **FOUR QUADRANT FORMAT OF e-CONTENT AND MOOCs** in which she began by explaining multiple uses of MOOCs for learners, the importance of technological integration with Pedagogy with special reference to NEP 2020. She also introduced to the participants the term **e-learning** and therein the emphasis on


LEARNING with the medium being electronic. She further went on to explain the basic difference between static content and e-content, and how the former can be converted into later.

Thereafter, she explained the methodology as well as all the important components involved in e-content creation in the four quadrant format taking interesting examples from across several disciplines keeping in mind the different disciplines of our participants in the FDP. Another very important aspect emphasized by her was the Authenticity and Integrity of e-content, which should not be compromised at any stage. Her session was followed by an enthusiastic Q&A session with participants.

Session 1 ended with a formal summing up of the session and a Vote of thanks delivered by **Dr. Vinita Kapoor** from Dept of Chemistry, Sri Venkateswara College, University of Delhi. She extended her heart-felt gratitude and appreciation to Prof. Vimal Rarh, for introducing the concept of FOUR QUADRANT FORMAT OF E-CONTENT AND MOOCs to participants. She also expressed gratitude to the entire team of GAD-TLC for their assiduous efforts and unwavering support in taking up this initiative for the benefit of our faculty members in our vision and mission to continue to impart quality education at Sri Venkateswara College.









Day-2 – Session 2 Date-01-05-2023

Title: Trends in Growth and Development of higher education

Resource Person: Prof. Ved Prakash


Prof. Ved Prakash gave a talk on "Trends in growth and development of higher education" on May 1st, 2023 from 6.30 PM to 7.30 PM.

He began his talk by exploring the changes in the faculty system from the 11th century to the 19th century, and how innovations were implemented in the first half of the 20th century. He focused on teaching and research developments by universities and how universities have to concentrate on providing degrees based on the demand, supply, and certification courses using different pedagogy methods. As per his statement, there is a drastic increase in a number of universities, institutes, and colleges in and around Rajasthan has 92 universities within the state. According to him the number of students opting for higher education has increased but not up to the mark of expectation and expectations might be reached by 2035.

Upskilling and Reskilling are two major points to be problematic for both students and teachers in the future according to him. He mentioned that to overcome this problem new approach to teaching is essential to the forthcoming generation and a step can be taken through MOOC and E-content Development platform. He said that Assessment and Accreditation started in 1994 to enhance the quality of education. He explained how research is neglected in humanities and social science departments and its importance to be concentrated.

He said that universities in countries like USA, UK, Australia, and Malaysia concentrate on research, teaching, collaboration, and communication. He suggested following the same, if possible, to fill the gap between industries and institutes. He mentioned that in the future the role of the teacher should be reachable to the local and global level of students. Accordingly, new teaching techniques have to be learned by the teacher and implemented as per the local requirements.

The session ended up with a question answer session for about 20 minutes and participants were happy in clarifying their doubts.






Title: GRAPHICS AND PRESENTATION TOOLS FOR E-CONTENT DEVELOPMENT

RESOURCE PERSON - DR ARUN JULKA

Dr Arun Julka, Associate Professor, Department of Commerce, Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi, addressed the session on "Presentation Tools and Multimedia Enrichment". He started his lecture with a discussion on learning objectives of the session which includes opening a presentation, selecting themes, inserting new slides, adding a text box, inserting pictures, tables, smart art, quick access toolbar etc. Then, he briefly discussed about inserting different sections in the powerpoint presentation. After that inserting smart art using Canva and Edraw mind were discussed in detail. All unique features of creating mind maps using Edraw mind were discussed in-depth. Finally, the unique features of inserting tables including inserting an excel sheet in the powerpoint presentation, shortcut to copy pictures, formatting pictures and inserting icons were explained. The resource person also took up all queries of participants along with the discussion.







Session 2

Title: Four Quadrant Format of e-Content & MOOCs

Resource Person: Prof. Vimal Rarh


The session began with the description of E-Content and its essential components which needs to be included while designing an outcome-based course. Further, the four-quadrant format of e-content and the components of each quadrant and their relevance were explained in detail. In addition to this, the guidelines pertaining to E-content development for a 4 credit course were discussed in terms of number of modules, amount of content per module, content type (video/presentation/text), duration and review process. Prof. Rarh also emphasized on the need of synchronized input (for static content) and output templates (for multimedia enriched E-content) to ensure faster development and publishing of E-content. Thereafter, she explained the role of Data Management in e-learning and the different ways to effectively handle, organize and review the files during the different stages of e-content development.


Next, the key stage of multimedia conversion, its importance and the use of story board technique for animation was explained with the help of examples.


Towards the end, the prime differences between the four Quadrant format of E-content on ePGPathshala and MOOCs on SWAYAM were reviewed and structure of MOOCs was explained with the help of a use-case.

The session concluded with a brief demonstration on "**How to join MyeClass**?" followed by a very interactive Q & A session with the participants.









Day 4- Session 1

Date- 03.05.2023

Title: Methodology for Development of e-Content and MOOCs ".

Resource Person: Prof. Vimal Rarh

The session began with a discussion on the structure and various components of a 4 credit, 15 weeks MOOC in which 13 weeks are allotted for Self-Learning and 2 weeks are dedicated for Revision & Assessment. Few innovative methodologies which can be adopted while designing modules for MOOCs were also described followed by various assessment approaches. She further went on to explain the methodology to develop MOOC from an e-content developed in four quadrant format.


An example of ARPIT-2020: Online Refresher Course in Chemistry For Higher Education was discussed and deliberated. Next, the relevance and need to learn working on a Learning Management System (LMS) was highlighted.

Thereafter, she explained the technical processes, tools and know-how required during content development, recording of video lectures, quality maintenance, uploading on the portal, for a professional MOOC.

The next part of the session revolved around the important topic: How to write a proposal and secure funding for developing MOOCs? Prof. Rarh also appraised and briefed the participants that the Assignment-1 to be completed for the assessment is going to be based on drafting a MOOC proposal.


The journey of Teacher's e-kit development was shared by her and subsequently she guided the participants about how to transition from a traditional model to a Flipped/Blended mode to enhance quality of teaching & learning and to inculcate higher order learning skills in their students.

The session concluded with a very interactive Q & A session with the participants.



























Session 2

Prof. A. K. Bakhshi joined sharply at 6:00 PM, and the second session was shortly started after Prof. Vimal Rarh warmly welcomed Prof. Bakhshi and he started his keynote address on "Assessment and Examination Reforms in India's Education System: Need of the Hour (learnings from the ground)". He structured his talk into four parts: assessment and evaluation and learning in the 21st century, what ails India's examination system, integrated assessment with revised Bloom's taxonomy and technology in assessment and future. The various education commissions in India to assess assessments and examination reforms in education and the need for transformation included in the NEP 2020 were beautifully explained. Also, he clearly explained the types of assessment, learning mechanisms, assessment in four quadrant MOOCs models. Prof. explained those points with brilliant examples wherever possible. Drawbacks and improvements have

been mentioned in the examination and assessment system in the country. He also touched on the latest technological advancement like chat GPT and AI and how they would impact education and assessment. Finally, the session ended with a summary and discussion of the topic, which was taken up by Prof. Vimal and Dr. Sarita Passey.










Day 5- Session 1

Title: VIDEO CAPTURE AND EDITING TOOLS


Resource Person: Dr. ARUN JULKA

Dr Arun Julka, Associate Professor, Department of Commerce, Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi, addressed the session on "Video capture and editing tools". He started his lecture with a discussion on a very interesting video editing tool called Clipchamp. He introduced Clipchamp as a video editor designed to make video creation easy for everyone, even for those with no prior editing experience. He discussed in detail how to combine your videos, images, and audio files, as well as add text and effects, and then save the finished video to your computer. He took queries of the participants simultaneously. Further he explained about video editing which includes cutting segments (trimming), re-sequencing clips, and adding transitions and other special effects. He concluded the session with the announcement that he will take a practice session on Saturday from 4:30 pm to 7:30 pm.






Prof Vimal Rarh, SGTB Khalsa College, University of Delhi addressed the session on "**Templates For Teacher's E-Kit_**".

- Queries regarding assignments and developing teacher's e-kit were taken.








Session 3 - 6:30PM TO 7:30 PM

Title: Strategies for Improving the Examination

Resource Person: Prof. Ved Prakash

Prof. Ved Prakash, Former Chairman, University Grants Commission addressed the session on "Strategies for Improving the Examination". Sir emphasized that improving the examination system involves a range of strategies that can help ensure a fair and effective assessment of students' knowledge and skills. One key strategy is to adopt a more diverse range of assessment methods, such as project-based assessments, presentations, and group work, to complement traditional exams. This allows for a more comprehensive evaluation of students' abilities and provides opportunities for them to showcase their strengths.

Additionally, it is important to provide adequate support and resources for students, such as access to study materials, tutoring, etc. Another important strategy is to ensure that exams are designed to assess the skills and knowledge that are relevant to students' future careers and goals. Moreover, there should be a focus on improvement of the examination system, by targeting the higher levels of Blooms taxonomy for assessment. The session ended with some interaction with participants and the Q and A round.





Day 6- Session I

Date- 05.05.2023

Title: Templates for Teachers' e-Kit- Part-2

Resource Person: Prof. Vimal Rarh

The session began by describing the template of **Quadrant III: Teacher's Assignment** of the Teacher's e-Kit 3 and its step-by-step preparation. Prof. Rarh explained the formulation of different types of Subjective and Objective Questions and their corresponding tagging in accordance with the revised Bloom's Taxonomy as well as mapping with the Program and Course Outcomes.


Thereafter, the group activity component of assessment was explained, wherein she explained the way of integrating the Sustainable Development Goals in the outcome-based education through projects and activities. Also the rubric for evaluation was discussed.

In addition, she explained the **Quadrant-I: Teacher's Manual** that is also the master document of the teacher's e-Kit 3.0. She talked about the module structure for effective Blended Teaching-Learning with components like syllabi, curriculum, learning outcomes and flipped classroom methodology.


This was followed by a very interactive Q & A session and discussion about the preparation of Teacher's e-Kit and guidelines for preparing assignment/projects required for the completion of the FDP.

The valedictory session began with Prof. Sarita Passey giving a brief report about the one-week FDP. Prof. Rarh extended her gratitude and appreciation to the coordinators and organizing committee of the 10 collaborating Institutions. Then, the coordinators of collaborating institutions were invited to share their views, experiences and feedback about this FDP. Thereafter, Prof. Bakhshi was invited by Prof. Rarh to give his concluding remarks and guide the participants about how they can also play a role in improving the quality and shaping up the future of higher education in the country. Prof. A. K. Bakhshi also spoke about the challenges our country will face in the higher education sector and how to tackle them. How to implement the technology and include the new teaching-learning, project-based learning, flipped classroom etc.

The session ended with a vote of thanks by Prof. Sarita Passey, Co-Coordinator, FDP, followed by National Anthem.




