This memorandum of understanding (MoU) entered into and executed on Tuesday, 29 September 2020 between **ALL INDIA INSTITUTE OF MEDICAL SCIENCES**, **NEW DELHI**, a medical college and medical research public university based in New Delhi, India having its office at Ansari Nagar, New Delhi-110029, India (herein after called as AIIMS), established in 1956 and operating autonomously under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India

AND

SRI VENKATESWARA COLLEGE, a constituent college of the University of Delhi established in 1961 in New Delhi, India, having its office at Dhaula Kuan, Benito Juarez Marg, New Delhi-110021, India (herein after called as SVC), co-managed by an independent trust, Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams and University Grants Commission of India, a statutory body set up by the Government of India in accordance to the UGC Act 1956 under Ministry of Education.

Each one individually called a "party" and collectively "parties."

Whereas, All India Institutes of Medical Sciences, New Delhi (AIIMS) was established by an Act of Parliament as an institution of national importance with the objects to develop patterns of teaching in undergraduate and postgraduate medical education in all its branches and to conduct high quality medical research for identifying new and improved diagnostics and therapeutics for diseases of national interest. The Institute has comprehensive facilities for teaching, research and patient-care. AIIMS has pre-clinical, para-clinical and clinical departments as well as several super specialty centers, which manage practically all types of disease conditions.

Whereas, Sri Venkateswara College (SVC), a co-educational and constituent college of the University of Delhi is considered as one of the best colleges in the country for sciences, commerce and humanities. Apart from offering courses both at the undergraduate level and the postgraduate level, several vocational and short-term add-on courses are also offered to cater to academic development of the students. Many faculties are involved in active research and serve as mentors for PhD students as well as train undergraduate and postgraduate students short-term internship projects. The college has established a central instrumentation facility as well as a Bioinformatics Center to supplement training. The college has facilities for sports, extracurricular activities and several associations/societies such as NSS, Eco Club, Enactus, Women Development Cell (WDC) among others engaged in student development and outreach activities.

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1. Scope of Collaboration: AIIMS and SVC agree to collaborate for developing the "AIIMS - SVC Collaborative Platform"

AIIMS and SVC wish to collaborate by signing a Memorandum of Understanding [MoU] to establish the "AIIMS-SVC Collaborative Platform" for initiating collaborations involving health awareness, social outreach and human resource development, which will have a profound social and economic impact for our country.

Presently, the MoU envisages but is not restricted to the following thrust areas in collaboration with SVC-

- i) Theme-based awareness campaigns and events (annual)
- ii) Various **environmental initiatives** such as the ongoing 'Green-school initiative', a collaborative effort between Dept. of Pulmonary Medicine & Sleep disorders, AIIMS and Eco club, SVC.
- iii) Awareness and promotion of Digital healthcare initiative of AIIMS
- iv) Organization of seminar/workshops/conferences on health-related topics.
- v) Organizing camps of various health issues including drugs, smoking & mental health at SVC.
- vi) Collaborations in field-based educational and research activities

Considering the growing population burden and the unmet health needs for a large population, there is an urgent need for creating awareness among general public towards several health and hygiene related initiatives. In light of the current pandemic, the gradual shift towards inclusive online consultations has the potential to meet several practical challenges faced both by practitioners as well as general public. One of the goals of this collaboration would be to engage student volunteers to promote this paradigm shift in healthcare sector. Environment has a major impact on well being of all individuals and thus engaging youth can bring about sustainability. The mission of the collaborative platform is to promote a systematic organized approach to identify the unmet practical needs in public health practice and work towards it by engaging student volunteers to promote it.

2. The Work Plan & Agenda of the Collaborative Platform (CP):

Since SVC associations (faculties and students) engage in various social outreach programmes on a regular basis and AIIMS has a tradition of regularly conducting medical camps as an extension to its healthcare services, joint collaborative efforts to plan and implement awareness programmes can have a wider public outreach impact. The two institutes are located in close geographic proximity, so implementation is feasible. To initiate the collaboration the following agenda may be considered:

2.1. The Steering committee will decide a focus area each year and nominate a Nodal Person/Department (AIIMS) and college association (SVC) to coordinate health awareness campaigns/surveys related to the designated theme. This will help to better

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assess the on-ground situation and coordinated work can help reduce health burden in long run.

- 2.2. Awareness campaigns related to Digital and public healthcare initiatives shall be initiated. The student volunteers would be provided knowledge of the various government health initiatives towards digitization of healthcare and telemedicine process. The volunteers would promote it in Delhi-NCR region by door-to-door and telephonic surveys.
- 2.3. Promotion of sustainable environmental goals among the youth of nation by both 'the Parties' in a collaborative manner.
- 2.4. Awareness programmes for youth regarding health, hygiene, addictions and drug abuse to be jointly conducted by both parties.
- 2.5. Collaborations in field-based research, awareness programmes, conducting workshops and offering training to students across various disciplines.

3. Committees

The activities of the Collaborative Platform (CP) will be guided and monitored by a steering committee:

Steering Committee: This committee will mentor the activities of the collaborative platform including initiation/continuation/ discontinuation of work, approval of joint collaborative initiatives and to suggest mechanisms to achieve objectives of MoU, monitor the activities under the MoU, to expand the scope of MoU, to review the overall progress and ensure self-sustainability over a period of time. It will also coordinate and monitor the day to day activities and functioning of the collaborative platform according to the work plan/ agenda mentioned earlier.

The Director AIIMS and Principal SVC will jointly Chair the steering committee. One faculty from each institution will be authorized by the Chairpersons to convene this committee and coordinate the activities of the Collaborative Platform in their respective institution.

Composition of steering committee, AIIMS

Dean (Research) will be the AIIMS nominee as the convener of the steering committee. In addition, there will be three senior faculty members from AIIMS, which would include two nominated by Director, AIIMS and Dean (Academic), AIIMS.

Composition of steering committee, SVC

Principal, SVC, will nominate the convener of the steering committee and three additional senior faculty as members of the steering committee.

The Chairs of AIIMS and SVC will serve in Ex-Officio capacity. Dean (Research), AIIMS and Dean (Academic), AIIMS, will also serve as ex-officio member of the steering committee and



their tenure will be co- terminus with their occupancy of their respective posts. Similarly, steering committee convener, SVC, will also serve as ex-officio member of the steering committee. All other members will have a three-year term. The Steering Committee will meet at least twice in a year to discuss to discuss the annual agenda and review the action report of the activities undertaken.

The steering committee can constitute subcommittees for a specific purpose and duration as and when needed to facilitate the work of the Collaborative Platform.

4. Implementation

- 4.1. Roles and Responsibilities of "the Parties": The collaborative platform will connect the faculties, students and researchers across the different disciplines in AIIMS and SVC who can develop specialized groups for social and public outreach interactions, leading to exploration of different ideas for benefit of society at large.
- 4.2. The parties agree that any intellectual property that is developed as a result of the collaborative activity will be dealt with by appropriate written agreements at the relevant time.

Dispute resolution

The parties agree to use reasonable endeavors to amicably settle any dispute arising among them in relation to the execution of the Project. In the event of any dispute or differences between "the parties" hereto, such disputes or differences shall be resolved amicably by mutual consultation or through the good offices of the Director, AIIMS and Principal, SVC and through discussions in the Steering Committee.

In the event of termination of the agreement, the rights and obligations of the parties thereto shall be settled by mutual discussions. The financial settlement shall take into consideration not only the expenditure incurred but also the expenditure committed by the parties hereto.

- 5. Period of MoU: This MoU shall he valid for a period of five years from the date of signing the agreement, with a further extension for 5 years unless otherwise decided after review of performance. Decisions about its extension, continuation or otherwise shall be jointly decided by AIIMS and SVC, DU six months prior to end of the above-mentioned period. Specific commitments made prior to such intimation or natural expiry of this MoU, shall be honored by both the parties. However, the rights/ obligations arising from the implementation of the MoU shall survive the termination of the MoU.
 - 5.1. The MoU may be terminated by either party after giving a notice or 90 clear days provided that this clause will be operative only if either party violates the terms of MoU or if the parties feel that no useful purpose would be served by further continuing it either due to change in circumstances or change in constituting parties.



5.2. Considering the importance of longevity of such large projects, "the Parties" will ensure high level of performance and productivity of the Collaborative Platform and uninterrupted long-term collaboration.



The moderator announced the results of the poster making competition, followed by a snapshot of the event which marked the end of the webinar.








4. Future Scope






a) Category 1 (CLASSES 4&5)






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
