




Promoting health and safety

We presented the facts about the CONFIRMED cases of COVID19 when the cases crossed 200







> **NSS** supported Zomato Feeding India, an NGO designing interventions to reduce hunger among the underprivileged communities in India, in collecting donations for their noble cause.








Standing up for Healthcare workers and Corona warriors

\Rightarrow Task Force for Sanjay Camp \Rightarrow



The NSS unit of Sri Venkateswara College stands in solidarity with the people of the world during the COVID-19 pandemic. At this point of time, we urge everyone to remain safe and follow the guidelines given by the concerned authorities.

Recently, NSS SVC had set up a task force that has been constantly monitoring the situation in our adopted slum, Sanjay Camp. The team has conducted telephonic surveys of the people residing there and has contacted the NGOs that have been working directly with the people of Sanjay Camp. After examining all the issues as well as the steps that are being taken, it's really disheartening for us to inform that essential services are not being completely provided to majority of the sectors of Sanjay Camp due to lack of funds and resources. Our team and the NGOs have been trying their best to provide essential services to all the people. NSS SVC is providing a helping hand to the NGOs working on the ground level. We'll be also continuing our projects through online medium. However,

we've been unable to expand our services further. Thus, we would like to urge the Government to kindly take necessary steps towards this cause. There have been people located out there who have rarely received any of the essential services. Moreover, the area constitutes of a lot of people who are daily wage labourers which further reduces their capacity to get food. Furthermore, it has been also reported that there has been an unequal distribution of essential commodities amongst the people which has lead them to an even miserable state.

In this sensitive situation, we would request the Government to consider this and take appropriate actions so as to provide essential services to the people of Sanjay Camp.

NSS SVC'S WORK DURING THE PANDEMIC SITUATION FOR THE PEOPLE OF SANJAY CAMP

March-April

22 March 2020: NSS promoted JANTA CURFEW through a VIRTUAL PLEDGE where nearly 50 volunteers turned up along with few students.

Pandemic is hitting hard to all classes of the community but most affected once needed help, hence NSS SVC promoted the PM CARES relief fund and asked people to DONATE, we also supported two more organisations collecting donations to help daily wage workers and street animals.

27 March- 16 April 2020: NSS SVC stands with positivity and started its #19DayChallenge where each day we taught people a different activity to try, we reached more than 100 people through this campaign. Activities included - Yoga, painting, drawing etc (all activities were indoor) and everyday there was a quick quiz competition to help people learn.

16 April 2020: We believe that Corona is not the only evil, but also the misinformation and fake news, we asked people to send news to us (if they feel it might be fake) and we will verify for them. We also clarified all myths around COVID-19 through this campaign. We started a campaign to support our #Coronawarriors, we made a video of including our volunteers with their participation from their home.

Mission Raksha (April-August)

Considering the ongoing pandemic situation, NSS SVC formulated a team of 10 members to provide aid to the people of Sanjay Camp. We assisted Light Up NGO in a crowdfunding campaign which provided food and other essential items to the needy ones. We subsequently started carrying out surveys and organize distribution drives, the timeline of the same is as follows:-

First survey – 20th April, 2020 (Under Task Force)

Our main purpose of this survey was to find out if they ration issue, sanitization problems, to spread awareness regarding social distancing, and to get more contacts so that we could connect with more people

• Second Survey – 23rd April, 2020 (Under Task Force)

We contacted more people and got to know about more issues

Third survey – 6th May, 2020 (Under Task Force)

Our main purpose was to take updates from Sanjay Camp whether they are receiving ration or not (Light Up was responsible for distribution)

• Forth survey – 9th May, 2020 (Under Mission Raksha)

Our purpose was to find out status of ration distribution, explain them to apply for temporary ration card on Delhi Government's website, sensitization regarding social distancing, to know about any instances of domestic violence

• Fifth survey – 16th May, 2020 (Under Mission Raksha)

We contacted people in Sanjay Camp to know about the status of ration distribution, any SOS requirements, to continue our project Each One Teach One

• Sixth survey – 9th June, 2020 (Under Mission Raksha)

Main purpose was to know about the status of ration distribution, SOS requirements, and information of children for Each One Teach One Project

Distribution Drive 1.0 (2 May 2020)

Mission Raksha in support from Light Up NGO distributed ration kits to 50+ families in Sanjay Camp.

Distribution Drive 2.0 (1 June 2020)

Mission Raksha with support from Pratyek Foundation and Uday Foundation distributed ration kits to 50+ families in Sanjay Camp.

Distribution Drive 3.0 (10 June 2020)

Mission Raksha in support from Light Up NGO distributed ration kits to 50+ families in Sanjay Camp.

Distribution Drive 4.0 (22 June 2020)

Mission Raksha in support of Light Up NGO distributed ration kits to 100+ families in Sanjay Camp.

Distribution Drive 5.0 (27 June 2020)

Mission Raksha in support of Learning by Locals and Goonj distributed ration kits to 40+ families in Sanjay Camp.

Distribution Drive 6.0 (17 July 2020)

Mission Raksha in support of Shades of Happiness NGO and Robinhood Army distributed ration kits to 40+ families in Sanjay Camp.

Distribution Drive 7.0 (6 August 2020)

Mission Raksha in support of Robinhood Army, Uday Foundation and Sewa Suraksha distributed ration kits to 50+ families in Sanjay Camp.

MISSION BRIDGE (September)

NSS SVC collaborated with Light Up NGO in an initiative called as Mission Bridge where we assisted the people of Sanjay Camp in accessing the schemes like Jan Dhan Yojna, Ration Card, Ujjwala Yojna. We helped around 100 people of Sanjay Camp in applying in these schemes.

AHAAN NOOR-E-ZINDAGI (November)

Asha - Mega distribution drive

9 volunteers of NSS SVC volunteered to help in the ground distribution drive in Sanjay Camp where we distributed stationery materials, sanitary pads, soaps, masks and refreshments to our beloved people in Sanjay Camp. Volunteers at home assisted the ground volunteers in callings and surveys. We covered around 300 people in the distribution drive.

OUR OTHER INITIATIVES

Each One Teach One

Through our project Each One Teach One we are able to teach 50+ students of Sanjay Camp online and provide them with all the help necessary for their academics. E1T1 also adopted educational tools such as Social and Emotional Learning, Quality Skills etc, which has helped in the overall development of the students.

Project Astitva

Sahyog Foundation conducted a menstrual hygiene session and sanitary pad distribution drive in collaboration with NSS SVC in Sanjay Camp for approximately 50 ladies.

Project Poshan

Volunteers of Project Poshan under NSS SVC conducted a sensitisation drive for around 200 people in Sanjay Camp. The people of Sanjay Camp are sensitized about topics like balanced diet, oral hygiene etc.
