#### **REPORT**

WOMEN IN STEM- Even in the 21st century, this phrase still raises eyebrows. Women are still considered less competent than men with respect to men, even though they are slowly flooding the field. In this context, the session was organized by project Astitva of NSS to gain crucial insights on the topic through a speaker session by Dr. Binuja Varma.

The session explored the various stereotypes and expectations in the field, including how women and men doing the same work are viewed differently, and how women's work is yet to be accorded equal recognition. The session also spoke about how societal attitudes shape women's idea of working in the STEM field, and how it is important to make STEM spaces more safe, inclusive and interdisciplinary- which would only be possible by incorporating Humanities in STEM- by transforming it to STEAM. Overall, the session left the audience with a lot of food for thought, and a better idea of the STEM field as a workplace than before.
