We reached the destination through a traveller bus which made it a comfortable and convenient journey for volunteers and pwd students. Almost 35 students in all visited the association. Later they were provided with refreshments and were taken back to college safely with utmost care and concern.

SUMMARY OF THE EDUCATIONAL TRIP:

The Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC) of Sri Venkateswara College affiliated to University of Delhi organised a special trip for the Pwd students of the institution to Blind Relief Association, a government aided NGO on September 1, 2022. The crew for the voyage included Pwd students, Volunteers and the associated faculty members of the college, Dr. Kanwar Singh and Mr Ashish Jain. The mode of convenience was an AC bus that departed from the college premises itself with all the necessary precautions. Honourable Principal of the institution, Prof. C Sheela Reddy herself gave her well wishes to all the students for the trip.

After a short journey of 45 minutes accompanied by some jovial conversations to lighten up the things, the crew reached the destination. It was received by the officials of the NGO.


After a little Ice break and dialogue with one of the mentors in the institution, the crew learnt about the history and functioning of the NGO with its area of operation and dynamics. Students also put forward their own queries to be rectified by the mentors. The crew along with some guides visited the skill development centre where the visually impaired folks were given training for computer and other necessary skills. This was followed by visit to Braille production centre where books and excerpts related for the students in the NGO were printed.

The next stage involved visit to the library where the EOC members got to learn about the peculiarities of teaching the visually impaired students and the methods of learning. The members were fascinated by the plethora of resources created in a systematic manner in the library for the students.

The final step involved visit to the handicraft centre where the students of the NGO had created art and craft works largely from recyclable materials. They were even available for sale to the normal audience. The trip concluded by group photographs and a return trip back to college before dispersal of students. The trip was a success and the associated students got to learn a lot from the detailed observations about life in the NGO. Also, the appropriate demeanour and protocol was followed in the BRO by the members of EOC so as not to cause any interruption in the learning process of students in BRO.
