The evergreen tree grows up to 20 meters in height and has typically spreading branches. It is native to tropical Africa. It is typically identified by its bell shaped, orange to maroon, waxy flowers that hang down from branches in long flexible stems, typically 2-6 meters long. They have a notable scent at night and are pollinated by bats, which visit them for pollen and nectar.
